Integrating Jack Mezirow's transformative learning theory with Esther Meek's covenant epistemology to form "covenant transformative learning theory" provides insight into the process of worldview transformation and has implications for cross-cultural missions, including methods of making disciples, planting churches, and cross-cultural missionary training. Because worldview transformation produces a change in the tacit patterns by which we perceive and interpret reality, this dissertation argues that a "covenantal transformative learning theory" provides a biblically consonant epistemological basis and a learning process to facilitate worldview transformation for cross-cultural disciple-making.
